



ZONTA INTERNATIONAL – DISTRICT 5 NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MAY 31, 2024

Note 1 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Organization

Zonta International is a non-profit, professional organization. It is a leading global organization of individuals working together to build a better world for women and girls. District 5 was created by the International Board to serve as the administrative link between the clubs within its established boundaries of Ohio, West Virginia, and Kentucky and the International organization. All share the same purpose – to further the objectives of Zonta International.

Tax Status

The organization is exempt from Federal income tax as an organization described in Section 501 (c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Basis of Accounting

The Organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the modified cash basis of accounting; consequently, certain revenues are recognized when received rather than when earned and certain expenses are recognized when cash is disbursed rather than when the obligation is incurred. This basis differs from generally accepted accounting principles primarily because the organization has not recognized accounts receivable and accounts payable and their related effects on earnings in the accompanying financial statements.

Fund Structure

In order to ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the use of resources available to the organization, the accounts are maintained in accordance with the principles of "fund accounting". This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds that are in accordance with the activities or objectives specified. Separate accounting is maintained for each fund; and accordingly, all financial transactions have been recorded and reported by fund.

Note 2 – In Kind Support

Zonta International – District 5 receives donated services from volunteers. These donations constitute a factor in the operation of the organization. However, due to the nature of donated services and lack of objective means of evaluation, they are not recorded as contributions. Board expenses reported but not reimbursed are reported as in-kind contributions.

Note 3 – Description of Funds

The Zonta International – District 5 Rules of Procedure require an annual \$ 6.00 per capita conference assessment to be paid at the same time as the District per capita dues. The District Board determines the allocation of the assessment between the Conference fund and the Convention Fund. The District Board shall transfer to the general operating account the amount of surplus Conference funds in excess of \$ 2,500.00 without further approval by District Clubs.

ZONTA INTERNATIONAL – DISTRICT 5 NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS MAY 31, 2024

Funds are described as follows:

<u>Conference Fund</u> – Established by the district to cover meeting expenses related to the annual District 5 fall conference/retreat. Fund is classified as Not Donor Restricted.

Operating Fund - Established by the District to cover administrative expenses related to the operation of the District. Fund is classified as Not Donor Restricted.

<u>Service Fund</u> – Established by the District to collect donations restricted to a specific charity or cause. In the year ended May 31, 2024, the District did not support any causes.

<u>Convention Fund</u> – Established by the District to help cover delegate expenses for the biennial Zonta International Convention. The fund is classified as Not Donor Restricted.

Note 4 - Subsequent Events

Subsequent events are evaluated through August 2, 2024, the date the financial statements were available for issuance.




